Take Action with FEA every Tuesday for **Power Hour** at 5:30. FEA staff explains bills in the legislature and ask us to call or email committee members on one or two topics. Go to <u>feaweb.org</u> to sign up.

Legislative Bills of Concern: HB 49 rolls back child labor laws that limit workdays and hours for 16-17-year-olds during the school year. HB 109 says that teachers can't vote on school conversions to charters, and may force districts to give them land. SB 7000 allows multi-year contracts but raises student test performance from 33% to 50% of teacher evaluations. SB 7004 does not require private schools with public funds to be graded A-F or to share test scores.

Black History Month will celebrate the Arts with a movie screening and panel discussion on Thursday, Feb. 15th at 6:30 p.m. at the CTA building. 10,000 Black Men Named George tells the story of the Pullman Porters' union organizing.
